
Dearest Great Falls Parents/Guardians,

USM to spend the day watching the USM Huskies baseball team with their pen pals.











Love is beautiful,


Love is what makes the Earth go around,

Amulet By Kazu Kibushi Review By Lucien



This is the most awesome book, and series, in the world. It's filled with action, mystery, and awesomeness. You need to read it! It's one of my favorites!




Mrs. Frisby and The Rats of <u>NIMH</u> By Robert C. O'Brien Review By Nash and Erin


HOOT Review By Hannah & Ali
